The Offering

The Peace

The God of peace make us holy in all things that we may be ready at the coming of our Lord.

The Eucharist

The Lord is here.

His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

And now we give You thanks because Your holy Son was awaited by the prophets, announced by an angel, conceived by a virgin, and proclaimed at last to men and women of every nation.

As we prepare to celebrate His birth, may He find us watching in prayer and obeying His commandments, with hearts filled with wonder and praise.

And so, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your glory, and join in their unending hymn of praise:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of Your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is He who comes in the name
of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through Your Son our Savior Jesus the Messiah; and as we follow His example and obey His command, grant that by the power of Your Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us His body and His blood.

For in the same night that He was betrayed, He took bread; after giving You thanks, *Barukh atah Adonai Eloheinu, Melekh ha'olam ha'motzi lechem min ha'aretz*. Blessed are you, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who brings forth bread from the earth.

He broke it, gave it to His disciples, and said, 'Take, eat; this in My body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.' Again, after supper He took the cup; He gave you thanks, *Barukh atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh ha'olam, borei pri ha'gefen*. Blessed are you, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who creates the fruit of the vine.

He gave it to them, saying, 'Drink this, all of you; for this is My blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.'

Great is the mystery of faith:

Messiah has died;

Messiah is risen;

Messiah will come again.

Lord Jesus come in glory.

Therefore, heavenly Father, with this bread and this cup we do this in remembrance of Him: we celebrate and proclaim His perfect sacrifice made once for all upon the cross, His resurrection from the dead, and His ascension into heaven; and we look for His coming in glory.

Accept through Him, our great High Priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of Your divine majesty, renew us by Your Spirit, inspire us with Your love, and unite us in the body of Your Son, Jesus the Messiah.

Adoration

Great and wonderful are Your deeds, O Lord God Almighty! Just and true are Your ways, O King of the nations! Who will not fear You, O Lord, and glorify Your name? For You alone are holy. All nations will come and worship You; for Your righteous acts have been revealed.

be blessing and glory and honor
and power forever.**
